You may have noticed that the entire length of the left side

of hole #4 is marked with green-topped red stakes as a penalty area. This area is a non-playable hazard. If your ball enters this area, play it just like the right side of hole #9, take a drop where you entered the hazard and add one penalty stroke. You cannot play out of this area! <u>Dan Rawlins – Major Tournaments Director</u>

Always Play Your Best

THE GAME, PLAYER CONDUCT AND THE RULES

In an effort to maintain the integrity of the game and protect our fellow competitors we all have responsibilities to abide by on the course.

Here are some of the things we should do:

- Play the course as you find it and play your ball as it lies.
 - This should be automatic every day.
- Play by the rules and in the spirit of the game.
 - Know the rules and apply them fairly.
- Apply your own penalties if you breach a rule.
 - Honesty and Integrity are key to the success of the game.
- Post your scores promptly and accurately after play.
 - Keep your handicap current.

Player conduct is another key element of the game. All players are expected to play in the spirit of the game by:

- Acting with integrity for example. By following the rules, applying all penalties, and being honest in all aspects of play.
- Showing consideration to others for example, by playing at a prompt pace, looking out for the safety of others, and not distracting the play of another player.
- Taking good care of the course for example, by replacing divots, smoothing bunkers, repairing ball-marks, and not causing unnecessary damage to the course.
- The Board and the Committee has adopted a code of conduct, as defined in the Roster Book, and you could be assessed a penalty for not following the adopted code.

Not everyone knows all the rules but you can ask for help from a referee, the Rules Committee or your fellow competitor. If the matter cannot be resolved in a reasonable time you my play a second ball in Stroke Play only and explain your actions or situation to the pro in the pro shop immediately after play.

There are times when you must make estimates, such as the spot where to replace your ball, the point where your ball crossed the edge of a penalty area or when taking relief under the Rules. You are expected to consider all available information and to make a reasonable judgment in the circumstances.

DEFINITION OF POTENTIAL - Is the skill level on any given day or round played that the golfer is capable of scoring? For purposes used for handicapping our Men's Club Major Tournaments, this number will be your Low Index. WEDNESDAY MEN'S PLAY WILL BE YOUR CURRENT HANDICAP.

Tuesday Work Group

The primary responsibility of the Tuesday Work Group (TWG) is to perform volunteer work that will beautify and improve Canyon Lake Golf Course and work with POA management to develop and implement projects that will enhance the golf course and promote play.

The TWG has been in existence for more than 40 years and has members who have served for over 30 years. They typically run 40 to 50 members on their roster with 20 to 30 eager to work each Tuesday. A typical Tuesday will start around 7:30 in the morning with donuts and coffee and a short safety meeting before assignments are given and work begins. They provide between 300 to 400 man hours of volunteer labor on the golf course each month. All work is coordinated with the golf maintenance superintendent and the head golf professional to limit any interference on the course. A few of the routine projects that happen regularly are sanding the divots on the course, trimming bushes and low hanging branches and concrete repair. Even though golfers are responsible to repair or fill their divot many go unattended so the "Sanding Crew" goes out weekly to fill divots that have been overlooked. Overgrowth of bushes and trees are an ongoing challenge on the golf course and the TWG "Trimming Crew" is out in force regularly to assist our maintenance company when needed. The golf course is over 50 years old with failing cart paths in many areas. The "Concrete Crew" does the demolition, grading, forming, mixing and pouring new concrete to replace many of the failed paths.

In addition to their normal efforts to beatify the golf course the TWG crews are responsible, in whole or in part, for many of the major improvements seen on the course today. A few of the notable projects are the setting of the giant boulders at each tee and the mounting of the bronze plaques. They formed and poured the concrete pads and installed all the cement benches on the course. They poured the concrete foundation and assisted with the installation of the post clock at the putting green and they rebuilt the rock hillside below the 14th tee box.

The Tuesday Work Group is managed by a seven member Board led by Chairman Sam Theodora. They work closely with the Operations Department managed by Steve Schneider and Field Superintendent Sal Medina.

The Tuesday Work Group is a tremendous asset to the golf course and the volunteers can take pride with their contribution to the community. Membership is open to anyone who would like to volunteer their time, meet new people and share their talents. Joining is easy. Just show up any Tuesday morning at the golf course maintenance yard at 7:30 am for donuts and coffee and be ready to go to work. For more information contact Sam Theodora at 951-244-4474.



Green Committee

The Green Committee is charged with the preservation, enhancement and maintenance of the golf course and works closely with the Operations Department to fulfill their responsibilities. The Committee consists of seven members and one alternate. Five of the members are appointed by the POA Board of Directors and three selected from major groups in the golf community. The current Chairman is Valerie Montgomery.

The golf course is a living amenity that can change daily and is affected by weather, maintenance and misuse and therefore the Committee works closely with both of the outside vendors that maintain and operate our golf course. The committee chairman meets monthly with the maintenance superintendent along with an Operations supervisor to tour the entire course to identify and record weak areas that will need special attention. The Committee also works closely with the golf professional for rules issues, cart matters or other concerns that would affect play on the course. The Green Committee also works closely with a volunteer group, the Tuesday Work Group (TWG), on an assortment of projects or repairs that improve and enhance our golf course. Aside from care and maintenance of the golf course the Green Committee works on larger projects

Aside from care and maintenance of the golf course the Green Committee works on larger projects as directed by the Board. Most recently the Committee has culminated over three years of work by identifying irrigation problems and discovering solutions that will improve the turf condition and save hundreds of thousands of gallons of water each year. The Irrigation project design has been completed and bids are currently being reviewed.

Another project the Committee has worked on over the past two years is their review of the maintenance scope of work which is part of the maintenance contract. Many hours were spent evaluating each section and incorporating the drought tolerant areas into the scope. The RFP went out late last year and to everyone's pleasure BrightView was the successful bidder and will continue maintaining our course through April 2026.

The Committee meets regularly on the second Thursday of the month at 1 pm in the Magnolia Room. It is an open meeting to all members of the community and visitors are welcome.
