**An Interview with Mark Louder,
Golf Course Superintendent – Canyon Lake Country Club

Canyon Lake Country Club Superintendent Mark Louder was recognized by Greg Pieschala, President of BrightView Golf Course Maintenance, for leading his department employees through **126,184** employee work hours without a reportable accident. That is over ten years without a major safety incident under Mark's supervision – a remarkable accomplishment. Congratulations Mark!

When I asked what this award meant to him, he responded that *“the entire team is proud of this award. Safety is an important culture at BrightView Golf. As Superintendents we are accountable for the safe performance of every person in our area of responsibility. My job performance literally depends to a large extent on the safety accomplishments of each person who reports to me”*. He expressed his appreciation for the focus on morning safety checks performed by Assistant Superintendent Justin Vasquez and his employee's attention to practicing safe actions. Although Mark's main responsibility is the maintenance of the golf course, he is always alert for safe and unsafe behaviors, no matter where he is. He is very proud of the fact that he was asked by previous POA Operations to share some of his training programs to improve safe behaviors in the POA and TWG operations. Accidents have also been reduced in those departments as a result. Mark's mindset is simply – *“to assure that you are as effective in preventing accidents as possible, safety must be made equal in importance to employee morale, costs and turfgrass conditions”*.

What is Mark proudest of? He feels that the course conditions have continued to improve every year of his tenure. He is especially pleased that the “foundation Bermudagrass” continues to get better each year, even with “overseeding”. *“Hard work and a lot of planning have yielded these results and the majority of residents seem to like the course”*.

What is his biggest concern? *“Water, without a doubt! Costs will be doubling in the next year and we will be stimulated to reduce water use as much as possible, potentially resulting in difficult conditions in the summers”*. He emphasized that it will be critical to upgrade the irrigation control and weather station systems to enable efficient water management during the upcoming years.

What continues to excite him at Canyon Lake Country Club? I was pleased to hear about his enthusiasm relative to the Drought Tolerant Areas and the opportunities that he sees for these sites. He hopes to be more involved with POA Operations, TWG and interested residents to develop appropriate design and maintenance of the DTAs to satisfy the goals of reduced water use, pollinator habitat improvement, enhanced overall appearance and strategic golf playability.

A key goal is to achieve Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Certification at Canyon Lake. Mark feels the golf course will be enhanced by the program modules of Environmental Planning; Wildlife and Habitat Management; Chemical Use Reduction; Chemical Safety and Maintenance; and, Water Conservation. Participation in the AI “Monarchs in the Rough” could be a community enhancement.

Mark is currently assisting a sub-committee of the Green Committee chaired by Dudley Thompson to develop a tree management program for Canyon Lake Country Club. He is looking forward to having clear guidelines addressing planting, removal and maintenance of the club's key trees, protecting these valuable assets for years to come.

How did Mark get into the business? As a youngster, Mark lived with his family in Texas and at twelve years old, he had a thriving business mowing neighborhood lawns. His family moved to England where he was enrolled in a private school that owned a 9-hole golf course. Students worked on the course where they were exposed to golf maintenance, golf etiquette and a fondness for the game that has served him well till now. Upon returning to the United States, Mark enrolled in California Polytechnic University, Pomona, California where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Park Administration, specializing in Turfgrass Management.

Mark began his career as Assistant Superintendent at The SCGA Members Club in Murrieta and quickly progressed to Superintendent at Quail Ranch Golf Club in Moreno Valley, Pala Mesa Resort in Fallbrook and then the head job at The SCGA Members Club. Upon the sale of The SCGA Club Mark was recruited by BrightView Golf (then ValleyCrest Golf) for the position as Golf Course Superintendent at Canyon Lake Country Club. Mark noted *“BrightView Golf and Canyon Lake Country Club has been a great employer for the past ten years and he looks forward to many more years to come”*.

Mark recently moved to Canyon Lake where he enjoys the lake and amenities with his children. Thanks Mark!

News and Information

Rules Reminder – Bunkers

Bunkers are specially prepared areas intended to test the players ability to play a ball from the sand. Confront the challenge and follow these restrictions

- You in the bunker when the ball is touching the sand or where sand normally would be.
- Remove loose impediments (grass, sticks, etc.) and moveable obstructions (rakes, trash, etc)
- Replace ball in same location without penalty
- Do not touch the sand to test the condition of the sand to learn information for the next stroke
- Touch the sand with a club right in front or behind the ball, in making a practice swing, or in making a back wing for the stroke.
- No penalty for touching the sand while digging in your feet, smoothing out the bunker, placing clubs or equipment in the bunker, leaning on your club, or striking the sand in frustration or anger.



Complete your round in no more than 4 ½ hours.....

- Play ready golf.
- Keep the group in front of you in sight
- If you're falling behind the group in front of you, pick up the pace.
- If you are on one side of the fairway and your partner is on the other, park your cart in the middle of the fairway and each of you walk to your ball.
- Limit your practice swings to one swing
- Be ready to putt when it's your turn. Read the green while your partners are putting.
- After putting proceed to the next tee then do your scoring.
- Keep track of your pace of play, 15 minutes per hole is 4 ½ hours.

SCGA Liaison Report: Dudley Thompson – reported that he talked with Jeremy Pitt at SCGA and that CLCC members who have 2 GHIN numbers on one email account will be purged. He will share additional information when he receives it from SCGA.

Secretary's Report: Ted Horton

Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

- Get well cards in August: Ray Fryer for a golf car accident.
- Sympathy cards in August: None

New Board Member Name plaques have been acquired.

Treasurer's Report: President Evans reviewed Treasurer Rod Smith's written report:

- The report presented the updated operating budget for 2019.
- The club bank balance as of February 28, 2019 is \$26,383.40. This does not include the Sweetheart Tournament that still awaits the Director of Golf's invoice.

Action Items:

- Refine accounting system – Director Poland & Treasurer Smith
- Perform financial audit – President Evans, Treasurer Smith, Secretary Horton, Director Poland
- Change bank signatures

It was moved by Director Watson, seconded by Director Halsey and approved ***"to accept the Treasurer's report as submitted."***

Handicap Report: Rick Halsey

President Evans reported that 1st Vice President Wilkeson will become the Social Director and the Handicap Director's position will be filled by Rick Halsey.
