If your ball enters this area, play it just like the right side of hole 9, take a drop where you entered the hazard and add one penalty stroke. You can not play out of this area any longer. There is more information later in the bulletin about playing penalty areas.

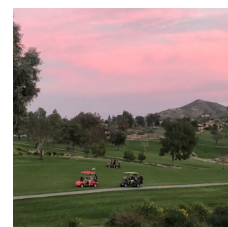

You need to know and tell.....

There is lots of talk in the community about the cost of Golf Course and the subsidy that it receives from the POA. Some suggest that there are only a few hundred golfers and it is a waste. We all know it is a valuable resource not only for Golf but for the beauty and open space it adds to the community. We all chip in and help take care of it. It is widely used by Canyon Lakers and their guests and contributes to the increased property values we all benefit from. Read these stories and spread the word. The golf course is a well-used, well cared for and a valuable amenity at Canyon Lake.

- Canyon Lake Country Club had approximately 35,000 rounds played in 2018 all day long. We currently have 300 annual members, 46 non-resident annual members and approximately 1500 other residents using the golf course each the year. That is nearly 2000 golfers using our course in 2018. Encourage play!
- The Tuesday Work Group (TWG) is an organization made up of volunteer members of the community and the Men's Golf Club. They currently have 50 members and work every week on Tuesday mornings from 7:00am to 11:00am. The TWG has poured all our concrete cart paths, constructed and maintains all the walking bridges, maintains the pond on #13, constructed all the retaining walls on the course, put in the split rail fencing seen throughout the course. Join in and lend a hand. All are welcome.
- Canyon Lake Association of Past Presidents (CLAPPS), have coordinated a golf tournament each year to raise funds for special projects on the golf course. Examples of these projects are the new hole signs at each teeing ground, the expansion of the practice putting green, the addition of an artificial tee surface for the practice range, the construction of the practice facility ball dispensing building and the new signature clock.



New Rules applied to the Canyon Lake Golf Course

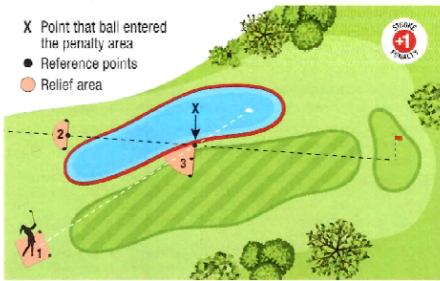
Penalty Areas

—Bodies of water or other areas defined by the Greens Committee
One Stroke Penalty assessed for relief

Definitions:

- Stroke and distance relief means going back to the original shot location
- Back-on-the-line relief means any location on a line through the penalty area boundary crossing point and the hole
- Lateral relief equals two club lengths from Penalty Area boundary, no closer to the hole
- Relief area equal to one club length and no closer to the hole

DIAGRAM #2 17.1d: RELIEF FOR BALL IN RED PENALTY AREA



1. Areas marked with red stakes/lines are lateral penalty areas.

Four options for play

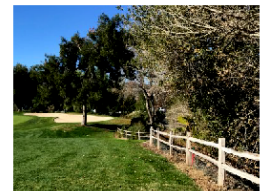
- Play the ball as it lies without penalty
- Play with stroke and distance relief (Point 1)
- Play with back on-the-line relief (Point 2)
- Play with lateral relief (Point 3)

2. Environmentally sensitive areas marked with Red stakes with green tops are lateral penalty/no play areas.

- Take relief without penalty if the no play area interferes with your stance or swing area

3. Areas marked with Yellow stakes/lines are in line penalty areas.

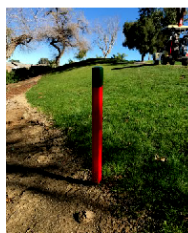
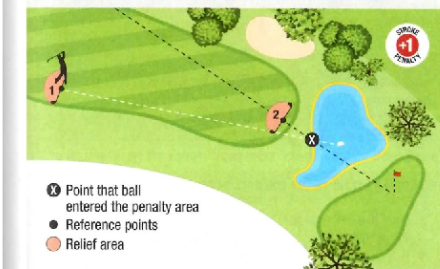

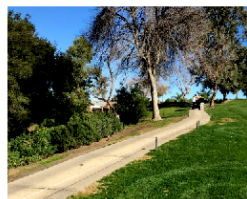


Hole 17—

DIAGRAM #1 17.1d: RELIEF FOR BALL IN YELLOW PENALTY AREA



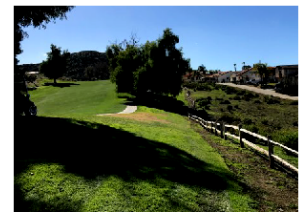
Environmentally Sensitive Area Stake Red with Green top

Except, the right side picket fence on Hole 16 is the OB boundary

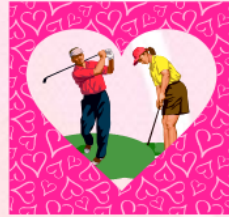

SCGA Liaison Report: Dudley Thompson – SCGA is extremely busy with year-end membership and 2019 Rules changes.

Secretary's Report: Ted Horton

Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

Action Items:

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Rod Smith presented his report, noting:

- The report completes the tournament financials for 2018. The Club realized net revenues of \$435 on total entry fees of \$40,514, or 1.1%. Per board policy, the fund-raising of the Stag Day tournament funded the losses sustained on the Member/Member tournament.
- Treasurer Smith requested board assistance to:
 - a. To determine how to account for how SCGA's monthly renewal policy distorts the timing of funds from the perspective of an annual budget;
 - b. To review the structure of the operating budget to put line items for activities that will be funded in the ensuing year.

3. We will be paying out the game money the following week. This may be temporary until it is determined how long it will take to post results. Results will be posted on a golf genius link that will send out to all of you.

4. Starting this week the skin games will be a choice. You can play in 18 or 31 but not both. If you are above 18 strokes handicap you will be playing to a max of 18 and if you are above 36 you will be playing to a max of 36.

5. Starting this week the skin game will be half pops. This was voted in by the board in November of 2018.

6. Check in will be with your chits for now, the entry fee will remain the same \$5.00 game and \$5.00 skins and \$1.00 hole in one pot if you choose.

7. All computer pick games will be the whole foursome. The new system will not be able to handle “pick your partner and computer picks the foursome format”. Please understand that some of this will change as we proceed with the new system.

P.S. If anyone would like to volunteer to help out on Wednesday morning please let Director Newsom know.

Wi-Fi speed is still a concern. Director Newsom will meet with POA staff to attempt to improve this for the Magnolia Room.
