There have been a number of comments about where to place the bunker rakes so they won't affect play. The Green Committee has addressed this issue and decided to make a change. In the past the committee has adopted the USGA recommendation to place the rakes outside the bunkers. Some members felt that was a problem when a ball would strike the rake and go in the bunker or interfere with an otherwise good shot. The Green Committee discussed the option of placing the rakes at the bunker edge to avoid affecting a good shot and for easy access for the players. This wasn't a practical solution since the rake could prevent the ball from rolling to the bottom of the bunker and leave the golfer with a more difficult shot that could leave them to deal with the bunker edge and/or the slope.



A third option was discussed to place the rakes in the bottom of the bunkers. This would be helpful to the maintenance



crew and would be the best option to keep the bunker rakes out of play but will require players to enter the bunker to retrieve the rake, rake their tracks and throw the rake back to the center of the bunker after their shot. While it is not a perfect solution the Green Committee has decided to adopt the new policy to have all bunker rakes placed in the bottom of the bunkers.





Getting to Know Eric Kazakoff, General Manager of Canyon Lake POAby Ted Horton

Eric earned a Bachelor of Arts degree with honors from San Diego State University, majoring in Industrial Arts and Construction Management. He is a California licensed General Contractor and has spent over 30 years in construction management resulting in successful ownership of Kazakoff Construction Company, Inc. for many years where he "developed and managed the lean and efficient cross-functional departments within the company to steadily grow until commercial construction came to a standstill in the recession of 2009". Recently he spent 4 years as CEO of Western Construction Auctions, Inc. where he "led and managed a leading, industrial auctioneering company in a challenging market, increasing overall profitability" and then 3 years as Project Manager/Estimator for Temecula Valley Drywall, Inc. where he "added a million-dollar commercial wood framing project at Long Beach City College to their scope of work, and constructed a number of other retail, medical, restaurant and office projects"

Here is where it gets a little strange for me to report. Eric used to be a neighbor of our older son in the Temecula Meadowview neighborhood and Nancy and I met him through our son over 15 years ago. His daughter and our granddaughter remain good friends to this day. Eric was also on the Board of Directors of this large HOA for 4 years. The rest is history - his project management skills are exactly what we needed and he was an instant success when he undertook the Main Gate, Golf Clubhouse rehab, Happy Camp and numerous park refurbishment projects that had been languishing for lack of project leadership. When the General Manager position opened several

months later, he had earned our trust and with minor realignment of duties and shared management tasking with Lynn Jensen, he was promoted to this position. A broad skill set from IT to contract negotiations has served him well but he feels "it's common sense and no fear of pulling the trigger that has assured my success". When asked whether there might be something about him that would be a bit of a surprise for us to learn, he didn't hesitate to note that he has visited Canyon lake friends to boat and water ski/ wakeboard and hydrofoil here for over 20 years. After many years as a guest, Eric is also the proud owner of a home here and a dues -paying member of our community.

Eric noted "the GM job is very political and I spend most of my time listening to people". His priorities are "to maintain and improve property values, keep up with neighboring communities and to be the backer and defender of POA Staff from noise and complaints." His goal is simply "to maintain and improve Canyon Lake to be on



par with the brand new communities surrounding us and to take everything that is now 50 years old and bring it up to 2019 standards". "We have created a very supportive corporate culture at the POA – employees are content, and we have each other's backs". It is important to develop this same relationship with the Community leadership and he will be sitting down with the new Board members to earn their trust. "Developing these relationships has never been a problem for me and I appreciate the weekly one-on-one sessions with the Board President and monthly meetings with the Board".

When asked about his management style, Eric noted that he considers his style "relaxed" and while he looks forward to committee advice and support, he feels that "the GM and skilled staff need to lead to make things happen". He is prepared to take the heat when wrong, but his management experiences lead him to believe "that this style is the best way to complete the many bottlenecked projects that have lingered as just ideas for far too long- it's the way I am wired". He finds it challenging to deal with misinformation and social media negativity. To combat this, he notes "it's important to keep one's head down, filter out the noise and focus on doing the job". He encourages residents to familiarize themselves with POA sources such as the Facebook Pages, Website, weekly email newsletters, etc. for accurate information.

I was pleased to see the prototype of the sign that will be installed at the entry to the Country Club. Eric can't wait to get this in place. When we talked about Long Range Planning he noted "that everything they are doing fits into this category. It's a 50-year old community and how can we endure another 50 years is my constant mindset – keeping Canyon Lake attractive, competitive, appealing, with property values growing – in short, the most desirable place to live in the Inland Empire!"

When talking about playing golf, I was pleased to learn that Eric is a golfer. He played recently "and embarrassed himself much less than expected". As a matter of record, "20 years ago, I hosted a Kazakoff Construction Christmas golf tournament and brunch at Canyon Lake Country Club". He is determined to get Steve Schneider and Sal Medina to play with him. We'd love to see you guys out there! Thank you Eric.

As we pass the halfway mark in your Board's term of office, it might be well to look back at accomplishments thus far and then look ahead at happenings still to come.


Continued growth in the clubs membership deserves special mention as the membership count went over the 300 mark.
