

Golf Course Lakes Restoration

Steve Schneider, Canyon Lake's Director of Operations, reported that the POA's water consultant has developed two solutions for reconfiguring the lakes between Holes 12, 13 and 14 and solving the leakage problem that has cost way too much in the past. Both solutions involve changing the configuration of the lakes, maintaining the water fountain but eliminating the waterfall. A third solution was generated by a previous consultant and replaces the lakes with a waste bunker and drought tolerant configuration. All three solutions will be reviewed in the coming weeks by our Pro, Pat Kemball, and the



Golf Course Architect at Brightview, our golf course landscaping contractor. Steve expects to present the three solutions to the Green Committee at their meeting on March 13, 1:00 PM in the Magnolia room. Anyone interested is invited to attend. This will be the best time for input from the Golf Community. The final decision will be made by the POA Board based on the General Manager's, staff and committee recommendations which favors maintaining the lakes. The project is scheduled to be completed by November 2019.

New Posting Computer at the Pro Shop

Finally, the problems with posting our rounds have been solved with the installation of a new computer — actually a new iPad purchased by the POA that is located in the Pro Shop on the right side of the front desk. The ON button is on the front right side of the screen, about mid height, that brings up a familiar and easy to use program. Use the touch screen to navigate and the on-screen keyboard to input the needed information. No need to worry about turning it off when you're done, it shuts down automatically after a few minutes. The front desk will help if you need it.

Remember, all rounds played (except Wednesday mornings are done automatically) need to be posted the day they are played and the related, signed score cards turned into the front desk. This is an important step to protect the integrity of our tournament play together. Please cooperate!

Call to Order: President Jon Evans called the meeting to order at 2:45 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance: Present were President Jon Evans, 2nd VP Chuck Newsom, Directors Greg Brack, Rick Halsey, Chris Poland, Tom Scudieri, Rod Smith and Jerry Watson. A quorum was present. **Absent:** Ted Horton, Chris Wilkeson, Pat Kemball, Mark Louder (excused)

Approval of Minutes: It was moved by Director Halsey, seconded by Director Watson to approve the January 2, 2019 meeting minutes as submitted. Motion carried unanimously.

SCGA Liaison Report: Dudley Thompson - All is quiet, nothing specific to report.

Presidents Report

President Jon Evans reported on the following

- Tom Scudieri has been reassigned to the Green Committee since our representative must be a POA member. Rick Halsey has ben reassigned to the Social committee.
- Women's Club President Ura Furry informed President Evans that they would not be able to contribute to the Bulletin due to a decline in their membership and their need to cut expenses. After discussion that focused on the value of having the Women in our Bulletin and the fact that three of our sponsors are Women's Club members, **Director** Scudierei moved and Director Watson s seconded a motion to continue to include the Women's club in the Bulletin as usual without any payment this year. Motion carried unanimously

Secretary's Report: Secretary Horton filed a written report that included the following

- Get well cards were sent to Tom Fuhrman (knee surgery) and Shannon Van Druff (hospitalization for blood clot).
- Sympathy cards were sent to Tom Pierick (loss of his wife) and the Scott Collin family (loss of Scott).
- No action on name plaques was reported.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Rod Smith presented his report, noting:

- The 2019 Budget that is based on last year's regular expenses, 245 regular members, and all reported sponsors. The budget includes a \$273 loss that will be easily taken care of with our reserves. No capital investments are expected this year. He cautioned that if all the sponsorship money is not collected, we will need to review the Board's policy on "giving". Director Poland moved, Director Halsey seconded approval of the budget as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
- The process of accounting for rolling SCGA renewals is ongoing. A process has been identified but an accurate renewal date for every member is needed. Director Brack agreed to provide the information he has. Once confirmed and the new process is put in place, we will be able to determine and report the amount of deferred membership income that has been collected each month.
- President Evans reviewed the list of sponsors that have not paid, and all Board contacts confirmed or previously reported that the checks would be received shortly.
- The books have now been reconciled for the past two years and are ready for the audit. The audit is expected to be completed in the coming month.

Membership & Rules: Director Brack reported the following:

- There are now 237 members, with 139 renewals done online (58.6%). There are now 3 Junior Members, and 3 Social Members.
- There were no rules issues in this period.
- Director Brack noted again that we need to consider a Saturday Game to attract younger members that work during the week".

Questions and Comments from the Floor

- Bill Levis reported the following on behalf of CLAPPS
- An invitation was extended to all Board members to join the CLAPPS annual Borego Tournament March 11-13.
- CLAPPS requested a contribution for their Beautification Tournament will be on April 27th. The 2019 Budget includes a \$1000 contribution and the **Board agreed to pay that on receipt of a written (email) request to Rod Smith.**
- Travis Montgomery will provide a flyer for the Beautification Tournament to be included in the Bulletin
- Don Norris requested a contribution for the Tuesday Work Group projects. Director Poland moved, Director Watson seconded, that the Men's Club make a \$1000 contribution to TWG noting that the amount was included in the 2019 Budget. Motion carried unanimously.
- Don Norris reported that TWG is planning a celebration for Hub Watson one Tuesday morning in March. All are invited to a BBQ in the Maintenance yard. Time and date to be announced.
- Team play has begun with John Keigwin leading the Thursday team and Rick Halsey leading the Saturday team. Director Newsom moved and Director Watson seconded a motion to provide a subsidy of \$1250 per team as budgeted. Motion carried unanimously.

Handicap Report: 1st Vice President Chris Wilkeson filed a report that included the following information. During the month of January 2019: 53 indexes went down; 85 remained the same; 95 went up; 2 members have no index; 8 members have a local index (over 36.4); and 2 members have reduced indexes. 859 rounds were posted by 170 members; 16 rounds were not posted; 5 cards had no date; 2 cards had names that were unreadable.

Major Tournaments: Jerry Watson

Director Watson reported that the Sweethearts Tournament has 64 players signed up to play and 70 for the lunch. We will play the women's style 4 player tin whistle in two flights – high and low. Both flights will have 2 closest to the pin contests. Complimentary range balls are included, and Pat will manage the scoring. Lunch will be Chicken Piccata, rice pilaf, vegetables and lemon cake. Travis Montgomery is providing the table decorations. Director Watson will send an email blast reminding everyone about the 9:00 start time. Lunch is expected to begin about 2:00 PM with the awards following.

Wednesday Game: Chuck Newsom

- Director Newsom reported that an issue has come up regarding the tees that the high handicappers should play from. Currently, players with an index lower than 28 play from the blue, between 28-34 they can choose to play from blue or white, and of over 34 they can play from blue, white or green. Each is expected to announce what tees they are playing from when registering. At issue is whether this is appropriate for each of the three games Wednesday – regular game, the skins game, and the hole-in-one game. It was reported that Chris Wilkeson had done quite a bit of research on this last year and come to some conclusion. Director Newsom will check with Chris and propose a resolution to the issue for the Board to consider and act on.
- . Director Newsom also mentioned a problem that has arisen with a member bringing in a guest regularly and dominating some of the two-man Wednesday games. There was general agreement that this was not appropriate and should be limited but not to the extent that it would prevent out of town guests staying in Canyon Lake from playing multiple Wednesdays while in town. It was pointed out that the Family Club accepts everyone all the time with a limit of 25% outside members per round. **Director Newsom moved and Director Watson seconded a motion to add the following rule to the Wednesday game.** "Members may bring a guest to play in the Wednesday game once per quarter, unless otherwise authorized in advance by the Wednesday game director."

Public Relations: Director Poland filed a written report and discussed the following based on that.

- The February Bulletin was produced and distributed on time. Changes in format and content appear to be well received. Suggestions for improving future Bulletins are welcome anytime
- In an effort to raise awareness of golf in Canyon Lake, stimulate membership growth, and increase the number of rounds played each year, the Bulletin is planned to be expanded to include information about all of Canyon Lake's Golf Clubs and more information about the golf course. We have direct circulation to the Men's and Women's Clubs and indirect through the Canyon Lake Men's club website. We have 20 pages available each month, 5-6 of which are available for monthly content. Director Poland suggested the following recommendations for Board approval.
- The men's club continue to fund and lead in the development and publication of a "Golf Clubs" Bulletin using sponsors money with requesting money from the other clubs.
- Continue to dedicate 5-6 pages each to the Men's club and to the Women's club, 1 page to the ALB. Allow 2 to 3 pages each for Men's and Women's Board minutes.
- İnvite the Ladies 9'ers and Family club to submit content, up to 1 page per month related to their activities.
- Balance of the pages are dedicated to general information (calendar, rules, news, and the sponsors). Add email blast to ALB, 9'ers, Family Club.

Update the POA website and move the Bulletin to the front page.

No additional cost to the Men's Club is expected.

- There was general agreement that this was a good idea, though the issues related to our relationship with family golf must be handled very carefully. We are not interested in taking them over only reporting their activities. Director Newsom requested that the title of the Bulletin be changed from Canyon Lake Golf Clubs back to Canyon Lake Golf to avoid giving the impression that we are trying to take over. **Director Poland moved and Director Halsey** seconded a motion to accept the recommendations. **Motion carried unanimously**.
- The Roster text revisions and updated membership list has been delivered to the Publisher. New cover with new logo is now under development. Joe and Travis will assist with the review of the proof. We expect to distribute the Roster by early March. Director Poland agreed to send out an email blast immediately requesting changes from the 2018 roster to provide one more opportunity to identify changes that have not yet been reported.

 Green Committee: Tom Scudieri

Director Halsey attended his first committee meeting before the reassignment and filed the following report that was discussed. Course condition. Mark Louder reported the greens have just been vertically cut with a needle point machine and are responding well. During the October closure conditions deteriorated because they tried a different approach this year that did not work. The greens were sanded first and then punched. The result was that the green grew back unevenly that caused the greens to be rough and caused natural pit marks. This approach will not be used in the future. Mark also reported that grass does not grow on the lower left front of the 10th green because there is not enough sun. Mark will continue to cut the greens down and roll the greens twice per week to smooth them out. He also said that the greens were running at 12 on the speed meter.

A no play zone has been created to the left of #4 and behind the green. The stakes have been placed on the hole and the no play zone is now in play. Any player entering the zone should receive a one stroke penalty.

Solar panels will be installed on the parking lot and be completed in October of this year 2019.

The tree subcommittee is addressing the drought sensitive areas that the POA is responsible to maintain.

 Some golfers are parking their carts on the course and at times too close to the greens. The rule on the book is 15 yds or 45 feet. The suggestion was made to give citations to those who violate this rule.
 The Green Committee is the communication link to the POA Board and Director Scudieri is the Men's club representative, a voting member and our link to the Board. The Men's Club Board determines the club's positions on the issues related to the condition of the course that need to be proactively carried forward by our representative. This is especially important since there seems to be a growing lack of communication with the POA Board on issues that are important to us to us.

New Business: Members of the Board are encouraged to attend a POA Finance committee meeting related to next year's budget tonight at 6PM

Next Meeting: Wednesday – March 6, 2019 – 1:45 p.m.

GUEST SPEAKER: Pat Kemball

Pat asked if there were any questions on the new penalty areas. He stated he has a local rule sheet which he will give to Ura to distribute to the membership regarding the penalty area. On Hole No. 4 the red with green top stake is a no-play zone. We are not to go into that area to retreive or hit our ball. If ball is hit out of that area we will receive a penalty stroke plus the normal penalty stroke. He may change how some of that area is marked, but at the present the edge of the cart path on the left-hand side all the way around the edge of the drought tolerant area will define the margin of that

Hole 10 is also now a no-play zone. It is all red now instead of yellow, which means that if it hits the bank on the other side of ditch and bounces back into the penalty area you can drop on the other side no nearer the hole. You must be

virtually certain it went across.

Pat is also going to a three-day rules school to check on some of the new changes. He wants to talk to some of his SCGA friends regarding some of our thick drought-tolereant areas becoming penalty areas rather than lost ball, stroke and distance and whether it would affect our rating. He also told us Saturday is Taylor Made fitting day from 10 to 2 if we want to make an appointment for a fitting. Callaway is also having a fitting on March 5th from 10 to 2.

"Canyon Lake Lodge, July 20, 1970 – An informal meeting was held at the old Lodge building to get the new Canyon Lake Men's golf Club started. Ralph Brogdon of Redondo Beach was chosen as the first club President, Bill Gibson of Santa Monica was chosen as 1st V.P., Harry Thompson of Los Alamitos as 2nd V.P., Dale Kroesen

At an informal meeting July 20 in the Can-yon Lake Lodge, offic-ers were chosen to get the new Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club start-

of Los Alamitos as Secretary, and Ron O'Reilly of Stanton as Treasurer. It was agreed that all would serve on an interim basis so that the club activities for the rest of 1970 could be planned and general membership meetings could be organized. An interesting note is that on November 30, 1970 one of the Board meetings was held at the Los Alamitos Country Club. I assume the reason being that the Board member's permanent homes were not in Canyon Lake."

At this same meeting the C.L. Men's Club Board of Directors decided that all new members who sign up by October 30, 1970 would be considered Charter Members. By the October 30th deadline there were 84 members who had signed up as Charter Members. In doing some research I was only able to locate three. Gene Brown, a Past President, who still lives in Canyon Lake and plays golf two or three times a week, Charlie Jenkins who also lives here but years ago gave up golf to concentrate on tennis, and Ron Devey who now lives in Orange County.

At a Directors meeting in November of 1970 it was decided to adopt the name "Canyon Lake Golf Club" as the club's official name.

An item of interest – On Sept. 26, 1970 at the Lodge a meeting of lady golfers was held, this meeting was the beginning of the Canyon Lake Women's Golf Club.

Another item of interest – It was on July 21, 1970 that the second nine holes were opened for play. Jim Magill – Club Historian
