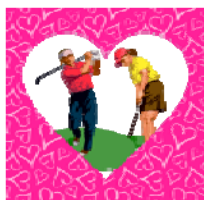

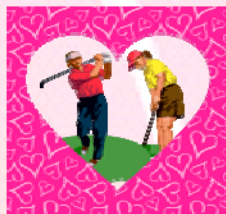

January 3, 2018

Call to Order: President Travis Montgomery.

The meeting was called to order at 1:45 PM followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call: Present were President Travis Montgomery, 1st VP Chris Wilkeson, 2nd VP Jon Evans, Directors Greg Brack, Gary Bradford, Ted Horton, Joe Kamashian, Steve McCain, Rod Smith & Shannon VanDruff. A quorum was declared.

6 members attended the meeting.

Acceptance of prior minutes: It was moved by Director Evans, seconded by President Montgomery and accepted (10-0) *"to approve the December 6, 2017 BOD Meeting minutes and December 13, 2017 BOD Organization meeting minutes as written"*.

Director of Golf: Pat Kemball thanked the membership for the support in 2017 and wished all a happy and successful 2018. Team play and Club shirts are slightly delayed due to formatting of the new POA logo. Pat reminded us of the upcoming "Rules Roundup" on Tuesday, January 9th where controversial areas of the course and rules changes for 2019 will be discussed.

Golf Course Superintendent: Mark Louder

Absent

Secretary's Report: Director Horton reported that all correspondence is current and adequate supplies are on hand. Correspondence for December 2017 consisted of:

- Get well cards - None
- Sympathy cards – Gary Bradford – loss of brother

Treasurer's report: Treasurer Rod Smith presented a proposed 2018 budget. After discussion it was moved by Chris Wilkeson, seconded by Jon Evans and approved (10-0) *"to adopt the budget as presented."*

- Thursday and Saturday team play were discussed. It was moved by Chris Wilkeson, seconded by Jon Evans and approved (10-0) *"to pay \$1,200.00 each for Thursday and Saturday team play support."*
- Treasurer Smith reviewed the check register for December 2017 with the Board, noting that Funds available are \$28,492.79.
- It was determined that Director Horton and Barry Talbot will meet with Treasurer Smith to perform the required annual audit prior to January 31st.
- Bank signatures – it was moved by Director Evans, seconded by Director Kamashian and approved (10-0) *"that the following be the duly authorized signatories on the bank account at Compass BBVA: Travis Montgomery – President; Chris Wilkeson – 1st Vice President; Rodney Smith – Treasurer; and to remove William Levis and Roger Kielty"*.

Handicap: Chairman Wilkeson reported that during the month of December 2017: 66 handicap indexes went down; 103 handicap indexes remained the same; 105 handicap indexes went up; 9 members have no index established and we have 9 members with local handicaps (Index over 36.4).

There were 1,028 rounds posted by 192 members: 4 cards were posted on the wrong date; 3 scores were posted on the wrong date.

New Member Temporary Handicaps – After discussion it was moved by Chairman Wilkeson, seconded by Director Bradford and approved (10-0) *“that, after new members submit five 18-hole score cards, the Handicap Chairman will assign the member a temporary handicap that can be used until an official SCGA handicap has been established.”*

- Chairman Wilkeson suggested that additional people be trained to manage the CLMGC handicap computer. The individuals do not necessarily have to be members of the Board.

Membership and Rules: Chairman Brack noted that there were no rules issues reported in December. There are currently 245 Regular Members; 6 new members since Nov. 1, 2017 (Welcome to David Derse, Ted Russelle, James Emmett, Jeff Straley, Carlos Yerba and Ted Smykla) ; 234 recent renewals; 77 renewed online (31.4%); 1 of the new members was comped (Director of Golf staff - Carlos Yerba); 3 renewals were comped (Director of Golf & Staff); and 2 Members are Juniors.

- The subcommittee of Directors Brack, Horton, Kielty and Wilkeson *“to assist POA staff to manage non-resident golf membership recruitment”* had no report. The CLMGC wishes to continue to support the program. Currently, there are 42 Non-Resident Members.
- A rules seminar to be taught by Judy Thompson, Pat Kemball and staff is scheduled for January 9th, 2018 at 4:30 PM in the Magnolia Room. Director Brack requested board member assistance for setup.
- Calendar year end membership renewal versus date of joining renewal was discussed. SCGA Liaison Dudley Thompson will verify with SCGA whether calendar year is still a viable option.
- Director Brack noted that the committee is developing a CLMGC welcome package for new members.

Major Tournaments: Chairman Jon Evans discussed the following events:

Sweetheart Tournament – Signup sheets have been posted for the tournament scheduled for February 11th, 2018. The entry fee is \$40 and the CLMGC board members are encouraged to play. Directors McCain and Evans will be working on the meal plan and details for the event. The other three golf clubs will be invited to join us.

Member-Member Tournament – After discussion it was moved by Director Kamashian, seconded by Director McCain and approved (10-0) *“that members must play in at least two of the club’s major tournaments in the year prior to the event in order to qualify for entry to the Member-Member Tournament”*.

Public Relations: Chairman Joe Kamashian reported that the Bulletin printing by Golding or Venus Printers was reviewed and the committee proposed a return to Venus Printers at a cost of \$140 per month including 50 printed copies. It was moved by Director Evans, seconded by Director VanDruff and approved (10-0) *“to contract with Venus Printers for monthly set up and printing of the Bulletin”*. Chairman Kamashian requested that all articles be sent to him at jkamashian@ca.rr.com .

- An updated list of birth dates is needed. Chairman Kamashian asked that we all assist to scrutinize that information for accuracy in the Bulletin.
- The 2018 Roster Book was discussed. It was determined that the cutoff for member verification, updates to rules, bylaws, etc. would be January 15th, 2018 with a goal of having the Roster Books available by April 1st, 2018.

Green Committee: Chairman VanDruff presented the recent green committee report noting that:

- The 21 Olive trees will be sprayed for fruit prevention at a cost of \$700.
- There is still a problem with traffic control ropes being cut and left in place.
- Tee markers will be rotated more frequently.
- BrightView fills tee divots three times per week.
- Curbing at the practice green will be repaired.
- Hole 1 – the possibility of installing a divot box at the tee was discussed.
- Hole 4 – the tee planter retaining wall will be removed and the bank sloped to the golf cart path. A split rail fence, similar to the one at the white tee will be installed along the cart path to prevent carts from driving through the mulch to the back tee.
- Hole 5 – The firmness of the tee will be addressed. Improving the appearance of the hydro seeded area left of the tee is being reviewed. As you leave the green, a row of rocks will be placed along the cart path to hold the mulch in place just before the tunnel entrance. Two (2) Pine trees 80 yards from the tee are scheduled for pruning.
- Hole 7 – a leak in Canyon Hills has been repaired and water surfacing across the course should be contained.
- Hole 8 - a “Tracking Form” has been submitted to the POA requesting installation of split rail fencing on both sides of the cart path.
- Hole 10 – the growth of the cattails in the ditch will be monitored. They are beginning to block the view of the front bunker.
- Hole 14 – a tree that blocks the view from the tee of golf carts on the cart path was discussed.
- Hole 16 – the tee box planter still needs a couple of finishing touches.

Wednesday Game: Chairman Gary Bradford reported that December contributions from the 50/50 were \$73.00 to the Veterans’ Day Celebration; \$207.00 to the picnic fund; and \$309.00 to the Hole-in-One fund.

- Chairman Bradford noted that today’s game was run with last month’s handicaps. He requested additional assistance at the Wednesday game 6:00 AM registration desk.
- Declining pace of play was discussed. 5.5 hours is too long for a round of golf.
- Management of the Hole-in-One fund was discussed.

Social: Chairman Steve McCain reported that preparations for the Rules Seminar and the Sweetheart Tournament are under way.
