# Beautification Tournament Raises Funds for Golf Course Improvements



On June 16th the golf community rallied together in support of the annual CLAPPS Beautification Tournament. The CLAPPS (Canyon Lake Association of Past Presidents) is a group of former Men's Golf Club Presidents who continue to serve the golf community with their annual fund raiser that has raised over \$70,000 over the past 12 years.

100% of the proceeds of the tournament are spent on improvements on the golf course. Recent projects include 11' tall Street Clock on the putting green, 13 concrete benches to replace the deteriorating benches that were removed years ago and bronze tee signs on every hole to identify the hole number and the yardages.

All this wouldn't be possible without the support of the golf community including the local businesses and members who generously donated to the event.

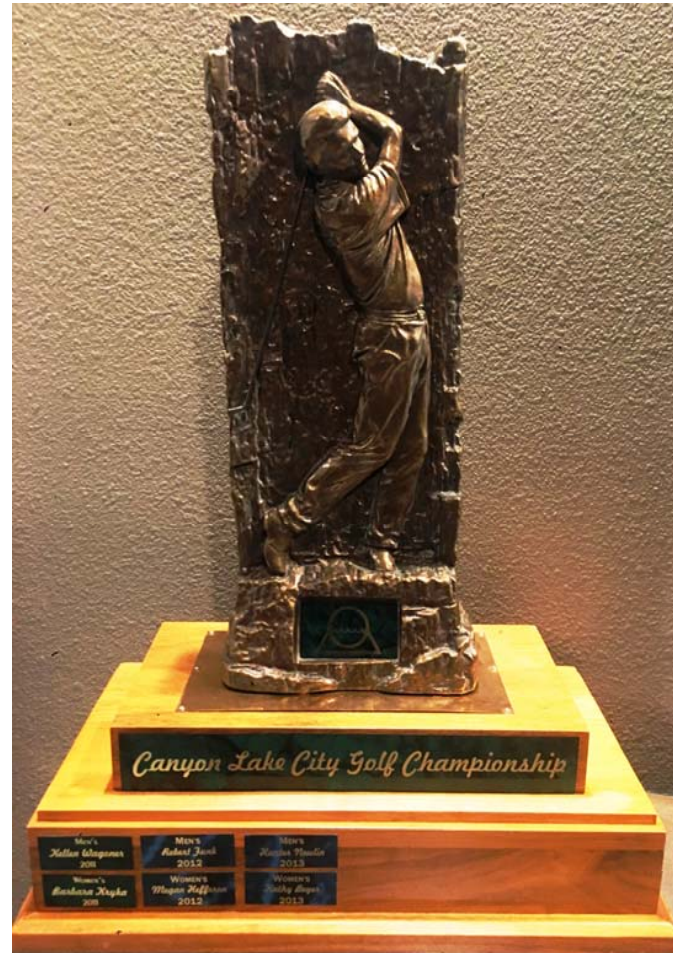

**Call to Order:** President Travis Montgomery called the meeting to order at 1:40 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Attendance:** Present were President Travis Montgomery, 2<sup>nd</sup> VP Jon Evans, Directors Gary Bradford, Ted Horton, Steve McCain, Joe Kamashian, and Shannon VanDruff. Absent were Director Brack, Treasurer Rod Smith and 1<sup>st</sup> VP Chris Wilkeson. A quorum was present. 4 members attended.

**Approval of Minutes:** It was moved by Director Bradford, seconded by Director Kamashian and approved "to accept the May 2, 2018 meeting minutes as submitted".

**Director of Golf Report:** Pat Kemball – Absent

**Golf Course Superintendent Report:** Mark Louder - Absent

**SCGA Liaison Report:** Dudley Thompson – No report

**Secretary's Report:** Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

- Get well cards in May: None
- Sympathy cards in May: None

Secretary Horton reported that the CLMGC Financial Review (audit for YE 2017) has been completed thanks to Barry Talbot who led and guided us through the procedure. A full report will be made at the July 11, 2018 CLMGC Board meeting.

**Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Rod Smith – absent

President Montgomery reported that an extension to file 2017 taxes has been approved and the accountant is now ready to file. The Treasurer's report will be presented when Treasurer Smith can attend the next meeting.

**Handicap Report:** President Montgomery reviewed Vice President Wilkeson's report, noting that during the month of May 2018: 104 indexes went down; 82 remained the same; 60 went up; 4 members have no index; and, 11 members have a local index (over 36.4). 1,033 rounds were posted by 185 members; 15 rounds were not posted; 9 cards were turned in with the wrong date or had no date.

Member Jim Magill requested clarification of the Wednesday Game rules for participants using the Green tees. President Montgomery noted that the **Game**, the **Skins** and the **Hole in One** are **open to all players** in the Wednesday Game as follows:

- Eligibility in the Game – Participants can use any tees.
- Eligibility in the Hole in One & Skins – Participants with an index of 0-28.0 must play from the Blue tees; Players with an index of 28.1-36.4 can play from the White tees or Blue tees; Players with an index of 36.5 and greater can play from the Green, White or Blue tees.

**Major Tournaments:** Director Evans reported the following:

President's Cup – April 21, 2018 – the tournament was successfully completed without fanfare.

CLMGC Championship Tournament – 55 Members participated in the tournament, but only 32 attended the dinner, resulting in a slight profit for the event.

City of Canyon Lake Championship Tournament – proposed for October 6, 2018. Canyon Lake CC golf clubs are supporting the event and will petition the POA, City and Local Businesses for financial and marketing support.

2018 CLAPPS Beautification Tournament – scheduled for Saturday, June 16<sup>th</sup> with an 8:00 AM shotgun start. Lunch, awards, raffle and silent auction will follow golf, starting at approximately 12:30 PM. All proceeds from this tournament are used to beautify the golf course. Recent improvements include the clock at the practice green and the benches on the tee boxes.

- Immediate Past President Bill Levis requested that the CLMGC financially contribute to the tournament. It was moved by Director Kamashian, seconded by Director Bradford and approved "to donate \$1000.00 to the 2018 CLAPPS Beautification Tournament". The contribution is a budgeted expense.

2018 Member Guest – scheduled for September 8, 2018. Past participation has been weak and as a result a number of suggestions were discussed:

- Could Temecula Valley Clubs be invited to participate in conjunction with the regular Member Guest;
- The event needs to be extra special if we are inviting guests to travel any distance;
- Could the event be cooperative with the Family Club;
- Could the event allow Member/Member play;
- 2 days – Friday & Saturday if the course is available. Morning or afternoon? Director Evans will check with Pat Kemball. It was suggested that the event be only one day until it is built up;

CLMGC Low Net Champion – participation of our Low Net Champion in the SCGA Championship was discussed. It was noted that the Club pays the entry fee for the Club Champion and the Senior Champion to this tournament. After discussion, it was moved by Director Bradford, Seconded by Director McCain and approved *“that the CLMGC will pay the \$150 entry fee for the Club Low Net Champion to participate in the SCGA event”*.

**Wednesday Game:** Director Bradford reported May contributions of \$75 to the Veterans' Day fund and \$209 to the Picnic fund. Play averaged 70 (49, 71, 70, 70 & 86) players per day in May.

Director Bradford reported spending \$30 on printer cartridges and noted that the imaging unit on the printer will need to be replaced at an estimated cost of \$210.

- It was moved by Director Bradford, seconded by Director Kamashian and approved *“to purchase a new printer”*.
- \$110.86 was spent on computer repair.
- We still need to upgrade the internet capability in the Magnolia room; President Montgomery will address the issue with POA Management.
- New Tournament Computer Software is being researched. Director Bradford will contact the SCGA to learn more about the USGA Tournament Package that is available to SCGA Member clubs.

Director Bradford reminded the members that there will be no Wednesday Game on July 4, 2018.

**Membership & Rules:** President Montgomery presented Director Brack's report noting that there are 250 members and that 87 renewals were done online (34.8%).

There were no rules issues in this period.

**Public Relations:** Director Kamashian reported that he is working with the City Championship Committee to obtain sponsorships and support from the POA and City. The event will be an all-Gross event flighted by handicaps. The event is fully supported by CLMGC, Family Golf, Women's Golf and Women 9ers.

The New CLMGC Banner will be placed in the store room, available for use when needed.

**Green Committee:** Director VanDruff reported that:

- Most of the Acacia bushes behind the green on Hole 5 have been removed by TWG;
- Rabbits continue to be a problem on the 5<sup>th</sup> green;
- Mark Louder & team will be adding plants along the Men's 8<sup>th</sup> tee on the right as you walk up the steps;

**Social Committee:** Director McCain reported that golf participation was weak (only 7 from the Men's Club, 15 from the Women's and 9ers Clubs and 2 from TWG). The participants enjoyed the day and felt that it was successful. Director McCain reported expenses as follows:

- Candy – 24 x \$13.99 (5.75 lbs bags) = \$335.76
- Flags & balloons & helium = \$99.82 Total = \$435.58

Participation in the 2019 Fiesta Day Parade was questioned. After discussion it was moved by Director Kamashian, seconded by Director Bradford and approved *“that if golf decides to participate in the 2019 Fiesta Day Golf Car Parade, CLMGC contribute \$500.00 for the cost of candy only (not balloons and flags). Participants will be responsible for decorating their own golf cars”*.

Director McCain noted that many participants followed the final group of the Club Championship on the back nine and that the meal and award ceremony after tournament completion was well attended, *“the way it should be”*.

**President's Report:** President Montgomery discussed the following:

Proposed Board Appreciation Dinner – President Montgomery thanked the Board Members for their efforts and volunteering time. He suggested that the CLMGC sponsor a Board and Golf Staff Appreciation dinner or lunch. Details will be worked on and a proposal will follow at a later date.

**New Business:**
