California Issues New Guidance For Face Coverings

The California Department of Health has issued a requirement for universal masking indoors statewide beginning December 15, 2021. The requirements states that masks are required for all individuals in all indoor public settings, regardless of vaccination status from December 15, 2021 through January 15, 2022.

The following individuals are exempt from wearing masks at all times:

- Persons younger than two years old. Very young children must not wear a mask because of the risk of suffocation.
- Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents
 wearing a mask. This includes persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a mask
 could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to
 remove a mask without assistance.
- Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication.
- Persons for whom wearing a mask would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulators or workplace safety guidelines.

In consideration of the new state order, starting December 15, the Canyon Lake POA will require members and staff to wear masks at all indoor amenities and offices.
