SCGA Team Play began in 1900 and has grown to include over 230 clubs 8,000 participants each year. This year Canyon Lake won our regional group #18 - which included Bear Creek, Eagle Glen, and Anaheim Hills finishing with a strong 5-1 record, scoring the most match points (197) in the entire league. They were then placed into a 32-team bracket and played single elimination matches each week. The first two weekends they played in rain, wind, and near freezing temperatures and managed to get past Seven Oaks (Bakersfield) and then Silver Lakes (Helendale). In the round of 8 they took on perennial team play powerhouse Red Hill CC (Rancho Cucamonga). Red Hill has won either Thursday or Saturday Team Play a record 7 times since 2005. They felt like it was David vs Goliath and just like David - we were able to take out Red Hill making it to the Final Four! Last weekend we took on Bella Colina CC (San Clemente) - who had dominated our Thursday team the last two seasons.... and again, we scored our 4th victory in a row punching our ticket to the finals.

Yesterday - your Canyon Lake Team took on a very strong Sundale CC Team (Bakersfield) - 8 players from this team played for Buena Vista CC in 2022 and won the Championship 46-2. We knew this was going to be a challenge and not only would it require our best play of the season - but we would also need all the luck we could get.

Final Score – Canyon Lake 26, Sundale 22.



CANYON LAKE MEN'S GOLF CLUB Recognized at Beautification Tournament! At the recent CLAPPS Beautification tournament the CLMGC was recognized for their support of the Beautification Tournament, dating back to 1975. CLAPPS President Carlos Ramirez stated that since the year 2000 the CLMGC has supported the CLAPPS Beautification Tournament to the tune of \$25,000, including \$2,000 for this year's tournament.

Carlos said that there are no financial records as to how much the Men's Golf Club donated prior to 2000, but there are old minutes that indicate that as early as 1975, and in subsequent years, they donated \$1,000 to the "Tree Tournament", the original name of the Beautification Tournament. It is estimated that the Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club has donated close to \$50,000 in support of beautification on the golf course over the past years.



HANDICAP HINTS



Handicap stroke hole allocation

There's a question that arises frequently: "Why has the SCGA rated hole 5 as the number one handicap stroke hole at our course? Our members all agree that hole 7 plays the hardest." Within that, though, are two misconceptions.

Misconception 1

The SCGA is responsible for handicapping the stroke holes at golf course facilities. While

it's true that the SCGA is mandated by our licensing agreement with the United States Golf Association to rate member courses a minimum of once every 10 years, the SCGA tries to re-rate our courses every seven or eight years. *However, the rating process doesn't include stroke allocation for holes.*

Misconception 2

The hardest hole on the course should be given the number one stroke allocation. The

USGA Handicap System[™] is designed to enable golfers of differing abilities to compete on an equitable basis. Because of this, stroke allocation should be looked at in terms of two golfers competing in a net match play event. The number one handicap stroke hole should be assigned to the hole where the bogey golfer needs the additional stroke in order to halve the hole with the scratch golfer. Ultimately, at the end of 18 holes, the match should be all square. Par is irrelevant in this exercise as it's not an effective indicator of a need for a stroke.

So how does the club determine where the strokes should be allocated? Section 17 of the USGA Handicap System offers two methods by which a course can apply stroke allocation to their golf holes. It can be a time consuming and mathematically challenging process if done by hand, but one of the benefits member clubs will realize by the SCGA's January 2010 change to the GHIN handicap system is the ability for the club to capture the scoring information and run the analysis themselves.

Comparison method

Scores of low handicap players are compared to scores of higher handicap players from the same set of tees. The club collects a

sampling of 200 gross, hole-by-hole scores from players whose course handicap does not exceed an 8 for men (Group A), and another sampling of 200 from players whose course handicap is in the 20 to 28 range (Group B). Scores should be gross and not adjusted for Equitable Stroke Control. Scores for each hole are then averaged for Group A and Group B, and the difference is then determined for each hole by subtracting the average of Group A from the average of Group B. The holes would then be ranked starting with the hole where the biggest difference is between Group A average scores and Group B average scores. Thus showing the number one handicap stroke hole where the bogey golfer needs that additional stroke.

Regression method

Allows the collection of 400 gross scores from players of all handicap levels. Scores need to be gross, not adjusted, and scores must be

provided from the same set of tees and from the same gender golfer. Each hole is evaluated by the score and player's course handicap. See section 17-2b of the USGA Handicap System for calculation instructions.

Analysis

For an 18 hole golf course the USGA recommends that oddnumber strokes be placed on the

front nine and even-number strokes on the back (it will equalize the distribution of strokes over the entire course and make matches more equitable). There are some instances, though, where back nine holes are significantly more difficult and the club chose to allocate the even number holes on the front.

It's also important that the club allocate the first stroke in a way to make matches more equitable between players of like ability. This formula should be followed for assigning the first six strokes. However, the club should give consideration to avoiding allocating the low numbered strokes at the end of each nine because you want players who receive strokes to be able to take advantage of them before a match is decided. Furthermore, in the event of a holeby-hole playoff, the club should consider not placing lower numbered strokes on the first and second holes.

This exercise can create great debates at your club! The club will want to consider looking at the stroke allocation numbers when the course has been rerated, but it's ultimately the club's responsibility for how those strokes are to be applied on the scorecard. Let the great debate begin!


Wet Bunkers:

Drains in the bunkers have become clogged and the water from rain and irrigation drain slowly creating puddles and wet sand. The sand becomes quickly contaminated. If the bunker drains slowly, the water is bringing fines to the surface of the sand making the material more dense as water struggles to get through. Also, the sand breaks down because of foot traffic, raking and general bunker maintenance and causes a very fine silt. Overspray from irrigation mixes with the silt and creates a hardening effect. Additionally, dirt from the bunker floor becomes mixed with the sand along with golf course debris that blows into the bunker. When a bunker gets washed out it also brings foreign dirt into the bunker. Contaminated sand clogs bunker drains even more. This Winter's extreme rainy weather is also a contributing factor to the contamination. According to several golf associations (like the USGA Green Section), the life cycle of a bunker is 5-7 years. Currently our bunkers are approaching 8 years old since they were last re-worked, so it's not surprising we are experiencing drainage problems. However, the warmer summer weather should help dry the bunkers out in the coming weeks. Other notes:


Please ride two to a cart to decrease the amount of carts out there that cause compaction of our turf and please keep carts away from the greens and collars!
